What is a Camporee?

A camporee is many things; an opportunity to live the Scout Oath and Law, camping fun for Scouts, the thumping of hundreds of feet on the way to an evening campfire, and the aroma of Dutch oven cooking or bacon and eggs. It is the ripple of wind-blown flags and hearing the frogs ribbits at night. It is catching the idea of teamwork in your own patrol. It is learning to carry out an order you do not really like. Then finding out how rewarding reaching a common goal can be followed by cheers and claps.

A camporee can be a perfect showplace for the Scouting program and, therefore, go far beyond a gathering of boys and girls. It is a perfect place to demonstrate the values of Scouting for both Scouts and Adults.

A camporee starts with the recognition that a patrol is the basic (camping) unit. The patrol demonstrates its very best camping techniques and shares its experiences with other patrols. The camporee involves equipment that can be carried in a by scouts and can be set up entirely by them. The equipment set up enables the scouts to be completely self-sufficient for a self-reliant experience over a period of two or three days.

Camporees is a districtwide event promoting Scout skills, developing teamwork and is fun for the scouts. Camporee programs may include several competitive events that test the patrol's "Scouting Skills", games and field events, and a Campfire. These activities show Scouting at its best.

Camporees can help councils and districts meet part of their goals. They stimulate overnight camping; they help units to attain part of the annual 10 days and nights of camping; and they help prepare units for long-term camping. Camporees thus help units to earn the Journey to Excellence Award.

Cub scouts can get an early taste of Scouting as they can campout and join in the festivities. Friendships will grow, bonds will be made, and the Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts will feel more comfortable in their transition to Scouts BSA.

Some of the planned activities include Archery, Low COPE course, lashings, and more. Should you have any questions or need help, all you need to do is ask. This is Scouting after all!

CHECK IN PROCEDURE

- Park facing out, so that you can drive out of camp without having to back up! Try to keep drive lanes open between the rows of vehicles. We want to keep all vehicles down in the main lot, not scattered around the event and camping areas.
- Upon arrival, please have a leader from your troop check in at the headquarters (the shed near the picnic table area) to get your <u>campsite assignment</u> and <u>Patrol Leader's Card(s)</u>. Event leaders will receive <u>event location assignments</u>.
- Each Unit is REQUIRED to have Annual Heath and Medical Records (Part A & B) for every Scout and Adult. Forms will be collected at Registration/Check-In and returned at Check-Out. Please bring them in a notebook or manila envelope.

- We'll be packed in it's a great opportunity to meet other scouts, but also will require some additional 'scout-like' behavior. Please respect other troops' camping areas, don't cut through them, etc..
- Leaders Meetings will be on Friday at 7:40 P.M. for all Scoutmasters, Event Leaders and Senior Patrol Leaders. Any special rules & information will be announced at the meeting.
- Cantin Dutch Oven cookoff. Dave Cantin was the Scoutmaster of T33 who was lost in the Montecito mudslides (along with his Eagle Scout son Jack) and Dave loved to cook with a dutch oven. We hold a competition in his honor see if your troop can take home top honors and get your Troop on the plaque that will be placed in the RA dining hall! Show off your skills however you wish it just has to be cooked in the dutch oven!

SAFETY AND CONDUCT

- All Scouts and adults shall obey the BSA rules and policies as stated in the Guide to Safe Scouting. All Scouts and adults shall obey the Scout Oath, Scout Law, The Outdoor Code and the Camporee Rules.
- A <u>Mandatory</u> Camp-wide safety meeting for all participants will be on Friday at 7:30 P.M.
- All youth and adult leaders must be registered with the Boy Scouts of America.
- Units must have two-deep adult leadership and all adult leaders attending must have completed Youth Protection Training. There is a minimum of 1:10 ratio of adults to scouts in campsite. Talk to us ahead of time if you don't have this ratio, we have enough adult volunteers to make something work!!
- No illegal possession or use of drugs, alcohol, harmful substances, fireworks and firearms is strictly prohibited. In addition, smoking, vaping, chewing tobacco or any other form of tobacco or herbal usage is strictly prohibited. No Pets. There is a NO TOLERANCE Policy.
- Scouts must always travel in the buddy system.
- All games like "Kill the guy with the ball" are prohibited. Scout leaders should immediately step in and stop these kinds of games or when see something dangerous or inappropriate behavior. No gambling or harsh language are permitted at any time.
- Any scout or adults with special needs should contact the Camporee staff so we can plan how to best accommodate your needs.
- If a fire alarm is sounded, gather up your scouts and adults and meet in the parking lot.
- First Aid will be located at the Headquarters Cabin, and BSA regulations require ALL accidents, injuries, illnesses must be reported there. Our medical officer/EMT for Camporee is Salvador Hernandez.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

- CAMP MEALS: Units are responsible for preparing their own meals (except for the hot dog meal on Friday night, and optional \$12 BBQ dinner (tri tip dinner from Country Meat Market!!) on Saturday night). All patrol cooking must be done under adult supervision. Saturday lunch should be a quick lunch, such as a "trail lunch" or non-stove required cooking.
- Hot dog MEAL: On Friday evening (please let us know on your registration form if you are eating) Two dogs
 per registered Scout and adult will be provided (FREE) at the BBQ area between 6:30 to 7:30 on Friday
 evening (only). Veggie patties will also be available for those Scouts and Scouters who are vegetarian or
 vegan. We would like a unit or group to help with cooking if interested.
- FIRE: NO OPEN FIRES WILL BE ALLOWED AT CAMPOREE; NO BBQ'S WITH CHARCOAL OR ANY GROUND FIRES WILL BE ALLOWED AT THE CAMPOREE EVENT. Only propane stoves elevated off ground ok. Charcoal for the Dutch oven cook-off will be provided.
- UNIFORM: All Scouts and adult leaders should wear their field uniform during morning assembly and flags, and Campfire. During the competition events on Saturday, an Activity uniform or patrol/troop shirt may be worn. Closed-toed shoes at all times (no flip flops).
 - PARKING: It is OK to drive your vehicles and trailers to your campsite to drop off your gear. All vehicles & trailers must be parked in the designated parking area after unloading. RVs and camper trailers are not permitted due to space. All vehicles must be parked head-out (Backed in). Inform the Camporee Committee if you plan to bring an equipment trailer so that we can plan accordingly. CARPOOL if possible. LIMIT OF 5 MPH AT ALL TIMES.
- PATROLS: No "ringer" patrols. Troop leaders are requested to be ethical about composing their Patrols. Patrols competing in events must have a minimum of 4 Scouts and a maximum of 8 Scouts. Troops may combine patrols to create a provisional patrol to meet the minimum/maximum number of Scouts in a patrol. Patrols with less than 4 Scouts may participate in all events but will not be included in the competition.
- ELECTRONICS: Please no electronic toys or games, trading cards, comic books, radios, or MP3 players (or the like of). For a complete list of prohibited items, please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting.
- GARBAGE: This is a Pack In, Pack Out event. Please bring trash bags and pack out your garbage to the dumpsters unless otherwise requested.
- WATER: Strain your dishwater, disposing of the strained material in a trash bag. Use the wide dispersal method (broadcast method) to dispose of dishwater. Please, no dishwashing in the restrooms. Drinking water will be available, but might not be immediately at your site, so bring some larger 1 gal or 5 gal containers to take back to camp.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION (Continued)

- KYBOS Scout Male and Female and Adult Male and Female port-o-potties will be available. Scouts are expected to keep these clean and only use the proper one. Any horseplay or scouts not keeping Kybos cleaned will be reported to the Scoutmaster.
- FREE TIME- We will have guided rides/tours of the Mountain Bike trails! Sign up ahead of time. Archery range should be open. We will run a 'trial to first class' activity for those scouts wanting to work on basic scout signoffs. There may be other activities going on during the free time which will be announced at the leaders meeting.
- EQUIPMENT: Bring everything you need including your patrol and group camping gear such as <u>dining fly</u> <u>tents</u>, lanterns, camp chairs, tents, and tables. Bring materials to build a gateway and other camp improvements. Bring a shovel Frequently helpful. Each site should have at least one picnic table.
- TROOP CAMPSITE AND FLAGS: Troop and US Flag and, or a sign, should be displayed in the Troop campsite area. Each troop campsite must be clearly marked with a Troop Flag or a sign. Unit Leaders camping areas should be clearly marked. Flags in campsite are to be secured against the elements.
- PATCHES: Participation patches will be provided for all registered and paid attendees. Patches will be issued when a unit checks out on Sunday. Saturday visit only members, pick up patch at check out.

TROOP/PATROL PARTICIPATION

- Each Scout should bring their Basic Scout Essentials (especially a filled water bottle), personal camping gear, Totin' Chip Card and Firem'n Chit Card. Scout Spirit points will be awarded to those who demonstrate true scouting spirit thru extraordinary acts of sportsmanship, patrol yells, and Cheer!
- Each patrol should carry 12 wooden matches, pocket knife, patrol first aid kit, at least one compass, paper and pencil, wrist watch, filled water bottle, and Scout spirit. Each patrol should bring one set of Scout Basic Essentials to the morning assembly These will be inspected as part of the patrol uniform inspection!
- Troops (or patrols) will be requested to conduct a skit, a run-on, or sing or lead a song during the Camporee campfire on Saturday night. Keep them short and one per Patrol. Please bear in mind that the <u>rules on BSA</u> <u>campfire skits have changed recently</u> while many of the traditional scout skits are now off limits, there's still room to come up with funny, silly, and -as they say- 'LOL' skits. Take some time *before* camporee to think about your troop's contribution!
- The Order of the Arrow may conduct a "call out" during the Saturday campfire. If you are an OA member, please come to the campfire wearing your OA sash. There will be an Ice cream Social for all OA members at 6:30 PM on Saturday night. Location TBA.

WEBELOS

Webelos dens are encouraged to participate as they can look ahead and observe what troops they might join. Webelos may participate in Camporee event stations if the event troop leader determines <u>it is age-appropriate</u> <u>to do so</u> and that their participation will not interfere with Scouts who need to complete these events to compete for their awards. When camping with a troop, Cub Scout guidelines still apply for all Cub Scout members.

Webelos can also stay for the campfire on Saturday night! Webelos who are attending only for the day will also need program appropriate adult leadership, and should have a good breakfast before coming to Camporee and bring a sack lunch, drinks and snacks. They can also purchase the optional BBQ dinner.

AWARDS AND SCORING

- Under the direction of the Senior Patrol Leader and Patrol Leaders, Scouts working as Patrols will demonstrate Scout spirit, leadership, resourcefulness, Scouting skills, and ability to work together. Inexperienced patrols are encouraged to use Camporee as a training opportunity. The goal of this event is to evaluate your Scout Skills in a competitive environment against other scouts using the patrol method. HAVE FUN.
- Patrols will be scored by the Troop providing the event and awarded individually for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in events. Campsite inspection, uniform inspection, gateway competition, and Dutch oven cook-off are all scored separately and will be awarded separately. The Dutch oven competition is an optional event and not counted towards the overall scores.
- Troops are scored and awarded for Presidential, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for the combination of the campsite inspection, uniform inspection, gateway competition and the patrol with the highest overall score.
- The score sheets in this booklet should serve as a guide for those that want to train or prepare for camporee. The actual scoring will be similar, but might not be exactly as printed here.

EVENT LEADERS (Please attend the Leader's Meeting at 7:40 PM on Friday night):

- Let us know at the registration table or earlier! the type of location you'll need for your event we'll do
 our best to accommodate you! (Example: large area, smaller area, etc.). If possible, your event should
 handle several patrols at the same time. If a line forms, Boy Scout patrols take precedence over visiting
 Webelos.
- Event score sheets will be provided to the event leaders in headquarters pavilion after the opening ceremony. Event leaders are requested to present the award ribbons for their events at the Camporee campfire.
- Please complete <u>ALL</u> the parts of the score sheet for <u>EACH</u> patrol participating in your event <u>including the</u> <u>patrol names</u>, <u>patrol numbers</u> and the name of your event!!

CAMPSITE AND UNIFORM INSPECTOR VOLUNTEERS

Please attend a short meeting at the assembly area that will be conducted on **Saturday at 8:30 AM** just before the morning assembly. This meeting is to help prepare you to conduct the inspections.

Please read the inspection/score sheets before you inspect! These sheets are updated (improved) each year!!

CHECK OUT PROCEDURE

Please police your campsite area and leave it better than when you arrived. Ask a member of the Camporee staff to check out your site before leaving. Individual Scouts who need to leave will check out with their Troop leaders (no check-out during the Saturday night campfire).

When you are given your Camporee patches, you are checked out! Remember your patches.
