### **Code of Conduct & Dress:**

All participants and staff are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the principles of the Scout Oath and Law. Tobacco, alcohol, and use of illicit drugs are strictly forbidden. In addition, in keeping with the LDS Church standards, we request no coffee or tea be brought inside the church or on the church grounds. We are their guests and should conduct ourselves accordingly. Adults and youth should wear the Field uniform of their respective program. Adults who are not uniformed leaders may wear business casual attire.

### **Course Organization:**

The course offerings are divided into five colleges. Each college provides position required training and unique supplemental education. The colleges are:

1. College of General Education
2. College of Cub Scouting
3. College of Boy Scouting
4. College of Scout Leaders & Commissioner Science

### **Can I Earn a Degree?**

The Univ. of Scouting degree program is an informal program of advancement in an atmosphere of fellowship and FUN. The intent is for you to be able to track your supplemental training and to reward yourselves for your accomplishments. The incentive is not only for you to carry on with your training, but to inspire you to return each year and share your wealth of experience with others as you advance on your own Scouting Trail.

You need not complete a degree to participate fully in Univ. of Scouting, but if you are interested, here are the guidelines:

1. The U of S Degree Program is open to all registered Scouts and Scouters ages 12 and older. Valid Youth Protection Training certification for the appropriate program is required for all adults.
2. Those who intend to pursue a degree, must fill out their Degree Program Application and submit it to the Registration Desk by 1:00pm on the day of the event in order to receive their certificate and patch at the closing ceremony.
3. Late applications will be processed as time and materials permit but may not be completed the day of the event. Records are NOT kept by the council. It is up to the participants to track their own courses and fill out their applications. A Scout is Trustworthy.
4. Each degree builds on that which came before, so the Masters Degree requires completion of the Bachelor Degree and so forth up to the Doctorate Degree.
5. The degrees available for youth under age 18 are the Associate and Bachelor.
6. Finally, if you aren't having **FUN**, then you aren't doing it correctly, **STOP IMMEDIATELY!!**

## ***Degree Requirements:***

**Associate Degree** – Open to all registered Scouters age 12 and above.

**Requirements:**

- Valid Youth Protection Training for your program (Adults)
- This is Scouting (E-learning online at [myScouting.org](http://myScouting.org))
- Fast Start for your position (E-learning)
- Attend minimum of 3 hours of classes at Univ. of Scouting

**Bachelor Degree** – Open to all registered Scouters age 12 and above

**Requirements:**

- Valid Youth Protection Training for your program (Adults)
- Fulfill the E-learning requirements for the Associates Degree
- Complete the required training for your Scouting position
- Attend 6 hours of classes at Univ. of Scouting

**Masters Degree** – Open to all registered Scouters age 18 and above

**Requirements:**

- Valid Youth Protection Training for your program
- Fulfill the requirements for the Bachelor's Degree
- Complete the Fundamentals of Training (Train the Trainer) course offered at UoS
- Teach one course for Univ. of Scouting or serve on your district or council Training Committee and help teach a training course.
- Complete an additional 6 hours of Univ. of Scouting courses (total 12 hrs.)

**Doctorate Degree** – Open to all adult registered Scouters age 21 and above

**Requirements:**

- Current year Youth Protection Training
- Fulfil the requirements for the Master's Degree
- Complete the Trainers EDGE course
- Complete an additional 6 hours of Univ. of Scouting courses (18 hours total)
- Attend Wood Badge and earn your beads

### **How to Use the Course Catalog:**

The purpose of this Course Catalog is to help you plan your day and is organized to include a class schedule and listing for each College, the course number, name, description and length of each course. The schedule matrix at the back of the catalog indicates at what time courses are offered. Use it to mark which classes you are interested in and then mark your first and second choices on your personal schedule.
